If someone uses your personal or financial information without your permission, that is identity theft. Identity theft happens when someone steals your information to do things like:

- Get IDs in your name
- Buy things
- Get benefits
- File taxes
- Take out loans in your name
- Commit other kinds of fraud using your name or identity information

You can take steps to protect yourself from identity theft. If you're a victim of identity theft, you can repair and prevent further damage to your identity or credit, **including avoiding criminal charges**.
